- TAC

Steve Lind: TAC hasn't met since last LLC meeting but will have a session at next LLC meeting to discuss planning for toll free ENUM trial and Provider ENUM.

The LLC will circulate draft Provider ENUM technical requirements seeking written comments in contributions to be discussed at the meeting. The next LLC meeting will be the week of March 13 in Washington DC.

- ENUM Forum

- Other industry groups

Jim Baskin and Steve Lind reported that the ITU-T Study Group 2 met this month and had some ENUM discussions. Because Interim procedures require annual approval, it was decided to hold discussions at the October meeting. A correspondence group for other ENUM issues (including infrastructure ENUM, based on AT&T and French contributions) was created.

Tim Denton reported that the CSCN recommended extension of delegation of 1.e164.arpa, but that he doesn't see the Canadian trial moving forward rapidly.

Steve Lind noted that it appears that the IETF ENUM WG is looking to wind down activities.

Andy Gallant asked what SG17 on identity management is doing re ENUM. No one had information on this.

- End-user trial Update

Tim Denton reported things going well. InCharge and Encirca are completing the authentication interface. Andy Gallant has provided test cases. The TPAC updated the contributed numbers report. The TPAC seeks to complete phases 2 and 3 by end of March.

- Provider Trial Update

Robert Schafer reported the trial is still on schedule. The PETPAC is considering which participants can execute which phase 3 test cases. Some cases have already been performed successfully. He expects testing to continue into March.

4. Q&A

Andy Gallant asked the status of delegation renewal and the FCC waiver. Jim Baskin reported no further info from USG on delegation status or waiver status. LLC still plans not to release the RFP until trial completion.

Jim Baskin noted a new end user trial participant, ENUMDNS.com.

Warren Bent reported the authentication system is functional and ready; just the interface to registrars is still being worked on. Since ENUMDNS.com wants to be registrar and authentication agency there will be a need to understand whether this will require further interface work.

Tim Denton asked for the last report to the USG to be distributed to the TPAC.

Anjan Bose asked if Robert Schafer is right person to discuss accelerating Charter's participation in the PETPAC. (He is.)
