## ***Status Reports***

Other Industry Groups –

Karen Mulberry stated that the UK group is moving ahead with a marketing plan and process for end user ENUM. Jay Carpenter asked what might be done to learn more about UK ENUM activities.

Jay Carpenter also stated that the NANC Future of Numbering Working Group is looking at a commons versus property rights model for toll free numbers and that part of that proposal could involve an end user ENUM registry. Jay further stated that SNAC is looking at how open market pricing of numbers might work and how ENUM might be leveraged for end user registration. Jay pointed to the [1300australia.com.au](http://1300australia.com.au) web site for information on open market pricing of numbers under the benefits tab. Jay also stated his belief that ENUM could be applied to this effort.

Debbie Guyton stated that the IETF BOF PEPPERMINT (Provisioning Extensions in Peering Registries for Multimedia INTERconnection) BOF has become the DRINKS (Data for Reachability of Inter/tra-Network SIP) Working Group.

### ***End User ENUM Update***

Jim Baskin reported that the LLC has discussed a potential roundtable to discuss the future of end user ENUM with ENUM Forum leadership, and the Forum leadership has agreed to work on organizing such a meeting in the next few months. Karen Mulberry asked if the framework for the meeting was known yet. Steve Lind indicated that, although there is no formal agenda at this point, the meeting might include a general review of the end user trial with the opportunity for trial participants to present. It might also include presentation of information from the UK and a more general discussion about views as to the benefits of pursuing end user ENUM in the US.

### ***Other LLC Initiatives***

Jim Baskin reported that the LLC has been working with Provider ENUM bidders to review their proposals and have just issued some additional questions. The evaluation process has been extended for another month (until the end of May) to allow responses to be evaluated.

### ***General Questions***

Jay asked if there was any evidence end user ENUM activity was picking up in the rest of the world. Outside the UK nothing was reported beyond the work in the ITU on the delegation procedures.

The meeting was adjourned. The next opening meeting will be on May 28th at 11am EDT.
